BELFAST 1923. William Spratt was born at Ardmillan in 1768. He was descended from a Scottish stock settled for a century and a half in that neighbourhood. He served his time with his father, Samuel Spratt, an eminent clock and watch maker.

William made rapid progress, and two years after his apprenticeship ended (1788) removed to Saintfield where he carried on a lucrative business for sixty years.

As he was considered one of the best mechanics in the North his trade extended over a wide area. He was an excellent clock and watch maker, engraver, gilder, and silverer; made musical clocks, spring clocks and more especially eight-day clocks, which are still numerous in the district, and much prized. The clock on the Market-house he made with his own hands.

As a man he was of good morals, sound principles, and possessed of a high sense of religion. He died on 2nd March, 1846, aged 80 years, leaving considerable property in Saintfield and neighbourhood.

The above and the Annals are from M.S.S in the possession of his grandson James Charles Spratt, Belfast

Some old eight-day clocks bear the inscription, "SAML. SPRATT, A.M." The letters A.M., which have puzzled many, simply stand for Ardmillan. Samuel Spratt died in 1821.
